






World Wide Web

Worldwide, 9 out of 10 people prefer their right hand to perform all kinds of motor activities. A small minority chooses the left hand for this. Small and big inconveniences left-handers face in our right-handed world.




I personally know all about that. Right-handers will never know what a hellish medieval torture device the scissors can be. not to mention the can opener. You have to twist yourself in all kinds of acrobatic turns while driving to get that bottle of Coke from the cup holder. Unconsciously, many left-handers are pros in yoga. Measuring tapes are always upside down, the handle of the drill is on the wrong side and don't get me started on an Ikea package. Such a fork in the snack bar with the serrated edge on the wrong side, a corkscrew that rotates differently or a lecture block whose spiral gets in the way. And so there are innumerable things in the world that I can mention. No, the life of a left-hander is not always a bed of roses.

But as one of the best football players of all time, and also left-handed, Johan Kruijff always said; every disadvantage has it's advantage! Leonardo da Vinci, Albert Einstein, Beethoven, Picasso, Diego Armando Maradonna, Lionel Mesi, Paul McCartney, Ringo Starr, one by one legends and all left-handed. impulse buying during lockdown

During the previous lockdown, the National Information Center for Companion Animals saw a large spike in the purchase of puppies. But many people who bought or adopted a dog then bring the dog back to a shelter now that they have less time. Several shelters are now full of puppies due to these impulse purchases. This is not only true in Spain, but also in the Netherlands.

If you are thinking about getting a pet, a dog or cat into your family and you are ready to adopt one, consider adopting a dog or cat from a shelter. That way you are doing a good deed because you are giving an abandoned animal the loving life it deserves. This also makes room for other dogs that need shelter. Most shelters already take care of the



necessary vaccines and raise the dogs correctly. So you get a healthy, partially trained dog. Unfortunately, there is also enough choice so that you can choose from different dog breeds what suits you best. And a final advantage is that it will cost you less than buying a dog from a breeder. In Spain, adopted dogs are fully checked at most shelters. are microchipped, get all the vaccinations they need and are spayed or neutered. You can usually pick up the dog from the shelter after a week to 10 days. Joe & Janice have been running the animal charity AID since 2008. Animals In Distress. Their goal is to rescue abandoned, abused animals and find forever homes they deserve.



For years they have independently helped animals in England.

They moved to the Costa del Sol in 1998 and helped animals whenever possible. A few years later they moved inland to Coin and became even more aware of the plight of so many animals.

Due to the amount of stray and abandoned animals, they became more involved in animal rescue and relocation in 2007 and in early 2008 they became a Registered Charity No. 7974 - CIF Nº G92937002. All dogs are in their shelter except the young and sick, who are cared for in their own home or foster family.

The mission is to find good safe homes for the lost, abandoned, abused animals in shelter and to network with other charities to find a home here and in other parts of Europe.



Most dogs and cats are housed in the Netherlands and the United Kingdom, a few go to Belgium and Spain. They do not receive any form of local government funding. So everything is paid for from donations. All the money raised is used to help the animals in one way or another.



Belangrijk of zwaar irritant

Ook zo'n hekel aan dat gezoem van die rottige muggen? Sla je het liefst hele families muggen dood zodat jij en je geliefden niet geprikt worden? Toch zijn muggen heel belangrijk voor ons ecosysteem. In de natuur heeft elk levend wezen een plek in het geheel. Als mensen zijn we geobsedeerd door nut. Alles moet praktisch nuttig zijn, en een volwassen steekmug is dat niet, maar als je zo denkt over de gecompliceerde natuurlijke systemen dan doe je ze geen recht. Vanuit direct menselijk perspectief is een stekende vrouwtjesmug niet nuttig. Maar als muggenlarven vindt diezelfde mug gretig aftrek als vissenvoer.



Een liter muggenlarven kost al snel 10 euro, best nuttig dus. Maar er is meer aan de mug dan liters muggenlarven en jeukende bulten.

Een mug kent een aantal levensfases waarin ze functies in de natuur vervult. Net nadat de mug wegvliegt en jou achterlaat met een stevige muggenbult legt ze honderden eitjes in plasjes, slootjes en ander water. Die eitjes komen snel uit en worden dan muggenlarven. Na een periode als muggelarve in het water verpopt de larve zich en wordt ze een mug. Slechts een kortere periode vliegt de mug als niet stekend mannetje of als stekend vrouwtje rond.

Een muggenlarve is een waterfilteraar. Als een buisje zuigt ze water naar binnen en filtert daar algen uit. Samen met andere filteraars zorgen de muggenlarven ervoor dat er minder algen in het water zitten. Die filterende functie wordt belangrijker naarmate klimaatverandering zorgt voor regelmatigere algenbloei in ons zwemwater. Als er te veel algen komen, kunnen zelfs blauwalgen gaan bloeien en daardoor kan het water giftig worden. Vissen, kikkers, libellenlarven en waterkevers eten graag muggenlarven. Zonder genoeg muggenlarven zullen er steeds minder libellen, vissen en kikkers zijn. Muggen kunnen dan, omdat hun voortplanting snel gaat,

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steeds vaker als plaag voorkomen. Een typisch gevolg van het verslechterende evenwicht in het ecosysteem. De steeds hevigere wisselingen tussen muggenplagen en blauwalgenbloei zijn het waarschijnlijke gevolg van de ineenstorting van het ecosysteem waar de muggenlarven deel van uitmaken. Maar niet alleen de larve is een belangrijk onderdeel van de natuur.



Vooral van de niet stekende mannetjesmuggen zijn er veel. Soms zijn dat zulke grote aantallen dat muggenwolken ontstaan. Niet schadelijk, maar juist intrigerend, ook omdat het gezoem van die miljoenen muggen een heel vreemd geluid is. Voor zwaluwen, grote liefhebbers van muggen, natuurlijk een feest om doorheen te vliegen. En niet alleen zwaluwen maar ook andere insectenetende vogels en zelfs vleermuizen genieten van die wolken voedsel.

Al die mannetjes in zo'n wolk zijn natuurlijk op zoek naar dat ene vrouwtje, de liefde van hun korte leven. Dat vrouwtje gaat na de paring op zoek naar een leverancier van bloed. Het vervelende moment voor ons mensen. Maar het aantal keren dat ik gestoken word is inmiddels gedaald tot misschien vier à vijf keer per jaar en dat is toch best uit te houden? Dus heb je een jeukende muggenbult, denk dan even aan de miljoenen muggeneitjes die je zo mogelijk hebt gemaakt, en het voordeel van schoon zwemwater, kikkerconcerten en die zwaluwen, zonder wie de lente een stuk minder leuk is.








40 percent of Brits are 'secret redheads' Russia has a high content of gingers in the Kazan region, as much as Scotland and Ireland have.

¿WEED, is it allowed or is it not allowed!?

The current scenario about marijuana in Spain is still a sensitive topic. We are dealing with a legal limbo in which the use of cannabis in Spain is legally prohibited and punishable, but in some cases is "allowed" by the authorities. The Spanish Cannabis Clubs exist thanks to a back door in the law that decriminalized the consumption of cannabis in private places.

There are hundreds of clubs scattered across the country. Cannabis clubs, or Coffeeshops known to us, offer their members various benefits. The quality of the cannabis is regulated, unlike black market cannabis. Members also get the cannabis for a reasonable price.

The Cannabis Clubs in Spain (particularly in Barcelona) are the result of legislation and legal gray areas.

There are now hundreds of these clubs. The Spanish Coffeeshops are always an association, which falls under a non-profit organization. You must always register for this before you can enter. In addition, you make a donation and receive a membership card. In these cases, according to Spanish law, you can just smoke your joint, if you are "caught" outside with this by the police you can be thrown on the receipt for 600 euros.

Although smoking weed in a cannabis club



so is allowed, smoking a cigarette is prohibited as in any business. In Spain, some political parties see something in legalization of cannabis, but other political parties do not want to hear about it yet. Perhaps after the results of a study by the University of Barcelona, they will think differently if they know that a possible legalization of weed in Spain could bring the treasury at least 3.3 billion euros in taxes.



According to the research report "Cáña-mo", legalization in Spain would result in an annual turnover of 8.5 billion euros with 3.3 billion euros in revenue for the Spanish government.

It would also reduce cannabis sales on the black market by 15%, according to researchers from the Unidad de Políticas de Drogas del Servicio de Psicología y Logopedia of the Universidad Autónoma de Barcelona (UAB).

Not only would more money be raised by the Spanish government, but there will also have to be better control over the production and sale of weed in Spain with legalization. About 101,596 jobs would also be created, which in turn would generate more money for Social Security.

The research writes that the black market is not expected to disappear completely, but it will decrease by about 15% and take a big dent with better control over the production and distribution of the cannabis. In total, legalization of cannabis would see an annual turnover of about 8.5 billion euros, on which the Spanish tax authorities 1.02 billion euros in VAT, 486.6

million euros in special taxes (such as that of tobacco with surcharges due to the black market), 371 million euros in corporate taxes, 1.4 billion euros in payroll tax (IRPF) and 26 million euros in export taxes. And if you're reading this, the legalization of marijuana may not last very long.

Happy Garden

If you also smoke weed yourself, you can go to the Happy Garden, a Coffeeshop in Carihuela. As you can read in this article, there are also certain rules that must be adhered to. If you want to enter here, take your passport with you, because information is needed for registration. When this is done you will receive a pass. You pay a donation of 20 euros for this. For this you get 10 points that are put on your card, the other 10 euros is for registration. The points on the card can be used for consumptions. If you want to see what the shop looks like and where it is exactly, scan the QR code below.

Aug. 2021 SERIOUS!? The Spanish healthcare

Here in Spain, Spanish healthcare consists of private and public healthcare. Private healthcare is provided by private companies, while public healthcare is provided by the Spanish government. Every resident of Spain who contributes to the social security system in Spain or who contributes in the Netherlands in the event of a benefit or pension is entitled to public care.

Public healthcare can be seen as the Spanish health insurance fund and comparable to healthcare in the Netherlands: everyone who in one way or another contributes to the social security system in Spain or who pays contributions in the Netherlands in the event of a benefit or pension is entitled to entitlement to public health care in Spain. All care is included, with a few exceptions, such as dental and ophthalmology. Public medical care in Spain is of a high standard and comparable to that in the Netherlands. Because the organization of care and accessibility is different here in Spain than in the Netherlands, this can give a strange feeling in the beginning. Many public hospitals are also very old and therefore look less clean, so that you (unjustly) look at healthcare from a different perspective. Fortunately, this is already changing, new/modern public hospitals are now being built.

In public medical care it is sometimes unclear how agreements are made, where agreements should be made, treatment of patients is different than in the Netherlands, doctors are even more on a pedestal here.



In general, Spanish GPs receive their patients from Monday to Saturday. Your attending physician (referring physician) is designated by the local health center in the place where you live. However, you can choose another doctor if you are not satisfied with him/her. Waiting times for an appointment are quite short and consultations are free, but also very short (about 5 minutes). And don't be surprised that the doctor's office door remains open!

Medicines

Medicines are obtained by prescription and must be purchased in a pharmacy. You pay a personal contribution that amounts to approximately 40% of the price of the medicine. Because the government has imposed a price reduction for medicines, medicines in Spain are generally cheaper than in other countries.



Private insurance

Anyone can take out private health insurance. There are no restrictions, except an age restriction: there are few, if any, Spanish private health insurance policies that include people over 65 (insured persons who reach the age of 65 will of course remain insured). Spain has a lot of private health insurance. When taking out the policy, pay close attention to the cover and especially read the 'small print'. That way you won't be faced with any surprises.

Spanish private hospitals are not necessarily better than public hospitals in terms of quality, but waiting times are much shorter.

You will usually be referred directly to a specialist and English is also spoken in most clinics. Especially in the tourist areas. In some cases you can even contact Dutch/German speaking doctors or specialists.

In addition to investing in new clinics with modern technology, you can also count on comfortable rooms (which you do not have to share with another patient) and good meals.
